

## SMAC Social Distance Match Rules

**We need everyone to pay full attention to this newsletter as failure to do so will put people at risk. Anyone seen to be not following the below rules will be immediately disqualified from the match.**

**Please note you must remain at least 2m away from other members at all times.**

### Booking on or off

You must book on or off a match by 10pm the Wednesday prior to a match. This will give us time to contact the fishery. If you are not booked on by this time you will not be entered into the match with no recourse. We really need you to work with us on this. Once the booking on text is sent out respond ASAP as no follow up texts will be sent at all. If an angler doesn't turn up on the day there will be no re-pegging and sections will not be altered so if you say you are going to be there please do so.

### The Draw

The draw will take place for each match via a zoom call – a link will be sent to attend a zoom meeting if you wish to witness the draw being carried out. This will take place the night before each match and the pegging will be done in conjunction with the fishery owners to make sure the right pegs are used.

You will be sent a text with your peg number and lake either via the WhatsApp group or text message.

### Pools payment and Pay-outs

Pools will be paid direct through **PayPal only** – you will need to pay any pools via the **friends and family** option to [peterboggiano@btinternet.com](mailto:peterboggiano@btinternet.com) if you've not got PayPal I will send video instructions on how to sign up

Pools must be transferred prior to the draw or you will be classed as not entering the pools. We will run the pools the same £10 for main pools and £15 for main pools and super pools. You must put your name as reference so I can qualify who has paid.

Pay-outs will be done also via PayPal. Once the weights have been recorded I will pay out via PayPal ASAP.

### Arriving at the fishery

On arrival to the fishery you must go straight to your designated peg no earlier than 8am and set up for the all in which will be at 10am prompt.

### Weigh in teams

If you have been drawn in a weigh team you will be informed of your specific role prior to the match. The roles will be dedicated and allocated by myself and Phil from the members drawn in the teams. We also usually have 3 members per weigh in team but this will be decreased to 2 with the 3rd member being an 'alternate' to stand in for someone who physically can't carry out a particular role or is in the 'at risk' category.

The full set of weighing in equipment will be left in a designated area at the fishery which must be picked up on arrival prior to the match. You will be notified of the designated area once the draw has been completed. There will be anti-bac wipe available for you to wipe down the equipment.

#### Role 1 - Bucket and scales Man

Pick up the full weigh in kit from the designated area prior to the match. Carrying the bucket and scales from peg to peg. You need to place the bucket on the ground so the angler being weighed in can tip his fish into the bucket. You must stand back whilst this is being done. The Bucket then gets transferred to the scales and the weight is called out. At the end of the weigh in the equipment must be returned to the designated area promptly.

#### Role 2 - Pad Man

Writing down the weights of each angler and sending a picture of the results on WhatsApp. **You will need to supply your own pad and pen for this role**

#### Role 3 - Alternate

Stand in for any member who physically cannot take part or a member who may be in the 'at risk' category.
